Our program's impact aligns with national studies showing the positive effects of arts participation on academic achievement and mitigating the effects of childhood trauma, as evidenced by the independent study conducted by the UNC-Charlotte School of Social Work on TAEP's pilot program. 
CULINARY CAMP HIGHLIGHTS




