




Welcome aboard to our latest newsletter and learn more about how we are "navigating through the arts and social emotional learning" with the students in our community.

ENCOUNTERS: LIFE SKILLS

This summer's Encounters Program was a fantastic opportunity for K-5 students from local YWCA Centers and teens from our partnering organizations to join us for a unique photography lessons and book making experiences. Students used a combination of Polaroid and professional cameras to capture special moments of themselves and explore the community focusing on capturing the essence of their surroundings and creating personalized photo albums and printed books to cherish.

Throughout the program, the theme of community was emphasized, tying into important life skills lessons on positive connections, building resilience, and social and emotional awareness. Students worked with artist and poet Shane Manier to pair their photos with impactful poems, resulting in a beautiful book that will serve as a keepsake for all students. Talented artists and facilitators along with several creative organizations, including Arts+, McColl Center, Nine Eighteen Nine Studio Gallery, Planet Improv, and Youth Meditation, partnered with us to provide a positive outlet for students to express themselves, explore new opportunities, and connect with their community in a meaningful way.

As part of our Summer Encounters: Life Skills Program, CMPD Officers joined us for the Promoting Peace + Justice segment of our program, which addresses community policing, responsible decision-making, gun violence prevention, implicit bias, and breaking cycles of trauma and violence. Sergeant Brathwaite and local CMPD officers actively engaged in meaningful dialogue with students by answering questions, sharing thoughts and experiences, fostering connections, and promoting a culture of peace and justice within our community.
